History

The origin of the modern-day BrettYoung is a 1930s woodworking plant. In 1934, woodworking operation owner Bill Brett joined forces with employee Reg Young to form Brett-Young Seeds Limited, a seed trading company.

Some of the first products the company sold were chick feed, horticultural peat, and legume inoculants. Soon enough, alfalfa, clover, and other forage seed varieties were added, and by the 1950s, BrettYoung was producing and exporting turf seed regularly. Our first seed processing facility was completed in 1953 and by 1965, a new, larger processing facility was built in Winnipeg along with a processing facility in Rycroft, Alberta.

1975 was a pivotal year for today's BrettYoung, with Peter Dyck purchasing the company after working for it since 1947. BrettYoung is still family owned and operated today, with plans to keep it in the Dyck family for generations to come.
